1.0 Rules

- 1.1 The Auckland Anniversary Day Regatta will be governed by the "rules" as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.
Attention is drawn to Regulation No.2 and clause 2.2 Yachting New Zealand (YNZ) Safety Regulations: The Maritime Transport Act 1994 states that the master of the vessel is at all times responsible for the safety of the vessel, the safety of those on board, discipline on board and for complying with all maritime rules, regulations and bylaws.
- 1.2 **Competitors shall abide with the prohibited racing areas as outlined in Attachment A – Prohibited Racing Areas.**
- 1.3 The YNZ Safety Regulations Part I shall apply to unballasted centreboard boats, open boats and sailboards.
- 1.4 The YNZ Safety Regulations Part II. The YNZ Safety Regulations Part II Category 5 shall apply to keelboats and multihull boats with the exception of the Passage Races where Category 4 shall apply to keelboats and multihull boats. It is recommended that all boats shall carry an inflated dinghy, a life-raft or tow a rigid dinghy capable of carrying the entire crew as per YNZ Safety Regulations.
- 1.5 The YNZ Safety Regulations Part V Category C shall apply to trailer yachts.
- 1.6 The YNZ Safety Regulations Part VI Category B shall apply to sports boats.
- 1.7 Appendix E shall apply to Radio Controlled boats entered in 16.10
- 1.8 The Racing Rules of Auckland Dragon Boating shall apply to Dragon Boats.
- 1.9 Waka entrants shall provide a Safety Boat for Waitemata Harbour events.
- 1.10 The NKOA New Zealand Rules for Waka Ama racing shall apply to Waka Ama and Waka Hourua.
- 1.11 Tall Ships and Waka to comply with Maritime NZ Rules and Regulations.
- 1.12 Should there be any conflict between the Notice of Race and these Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions shall prevail. This amends RRS Rule 63.7

2.0 Changes to Sailing Instructions

Any changes to the rules will be set out in the Sailing Instructions applicable to the venue hosting an event.

3.0 Race Pennants

All keelboat, multihulls over 6m & trailer yacht competitors shall fly a backstay divisional race pennant as listed.

4.0 Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1 The regatta is open to boats that comply with Clause 1.0 Rules
- 4.2 Measurement certificates should be available if requested.
- 4.3 Keelboats may use extras except for those competing in Passage Races designated 'no extras'

5.0 Race Areas

The races will be held in the Hauraki Gulf, the Waitemata and Viaduct Harbours and Westhaven Marina.

6.0 Centreboard Courses

The courses will be as described by the host club sailing instructions for all centreboard races

7.0 Penalty System

RRS Rule 44 shall apply for all boats. Appendix P may also apply.

8.0 Time Limit

The time limit for all races shall be 1700 hrs.

9.0 Protests

Protests must be lodged with the AAR Committee, on 021 818 448 or 021 652 101, no later than two hours after the last boat in the race finishes (Rule 61.3) on Monday 1 February 2021. Any protests will take place at the Royal NZ Yacht Squadron at 1800hrs on Tuesday 2 February 2021, unless otherwise notified.

10.0 Scoring

10.1 The Low Points Scoring System of Appendix A will apply.

10.2 Handicaps will be calculated using handicaps set by the AARC with the assistance of Class handicappers, the New Zealand Trailer Yacht Association and YNZ PHRF systems.

10.3 No score will be excluded. This changes A2.

11.0 Safety Regulations

Any yacht withdrawing from a race for any reason **MUST** notify Race Control on either:

14.0 Results

Any results appearing on the Auckland Anniversary Regatta website shall be provisional only (subject to the hearing of any protests) until confirmed as Final. Results will be available for inspection at participating yacht clubs as soon as possible, and on the AAR website: www.regatta.org.nz

15.0 Prizes

15.1 Trophies and prizes will be presented at the Official Prizegiving, commencing at 1830hrs Tuesday 16 February 2021 at the Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron, Westhaven.

Skippers must be present to collect spot prizes. Skippers must be present to claim cash prizes unless residing 50km from the Royal NZ Yacht Squadron and unable to attend the Prizegiving. These prizes will be transferred online to the winning skipper's bank account on receipt of the account details.

15.2 Waitemata Harbour Races Class Prizes: Additional prizes will be awarded to classes with a minimum of 5 or more entries.

Course: Start W to E; red navigation marker 20 (Port); green navigation marker 19 (Port); laid separation buoy (Port); Yellow Westhaven buoy (Port) to finish W to E.

16.3 Waitemata Harbour Race – Classic Launches

Warning Signal: 1055hrs Race Start: 1100hrs

Start Line: A line between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel flying the AARC flag positioned off the Westhaven wave break and the course side of a laid mark.

Finish Line: A line North of the laid mark on a transit with the race committee vessel.

Please ensure launches pass to the North of the laid mark to avoid any yacht race starts.

Course: Start W to E; red navigation marker 20 (Port); green navigation marker 19 (Port); to finish E to W.

Courses for Waitemata Harbour Races

Courses will be advised on **VHF 4** prior to each race start and numeric flags & course numbers will be displayed from the race committee vessel.

Start & Finish Line: A line between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel flying the AARC flag positioned off the Westhaven wave break and the course side of a laid mark.

Course for ALL Keelboats and Mullet boats:

Start to Torpedo Buoy (S), North Head Buoy (P), Cable Buoy (S), Saltworks Buoy (S), Northern Leading Buoy (S), Orakei Buoy (S), Resolution Buoy (S), to finish. Distance: Approximately 14.0 nm.

Waka Ama (Outrigger Canoe)

Course 1: Start W to E; yellow Bean Rock buoy (P); to finish E to W. Distance: 6.0nm

Course 2: Start W to E; yellow Orakei buoy (P); to finish E to W. Distance: 4.5nm

Waka Hourua (Sailing Canoe)

Course 1: Start W to E; Motukorea Beacon (S); to finish E to W. Distance: 14.2nm

Course 2: Start W to E; yellow Bean Rock buoy (S); to finish E to W. Distance: 6.0nm

Course: Start from NW to SE, Outer Whangaparaoa Navy Buoy (S) to finish from E to W.

Course: Start E to W, Outer Whangaparaoa Navy Buoy (S) to finish E to W.

Finish Line: A line between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee vessel flying the AARC flag positioned off the Westhaven wave break and the course side of a laid mark.

Course 1: Start from N to S passing Motutapu Is (S), Motuihe Passage, yellow Motukorea Buoy(S), yellow Salt Works Buoy (P), yellow Torpedo Buoy (S), to finish E to W.

Course 2: Start from N to S passing Motuihe Island (S), Illomama yellow buoy (P), Bean Rock (P), to finish E to W.
